Statues of Hermes, called herms, were common in the ancient world and symbols of fertility. They were intended to bring prosperity and luck. A herm might be found outside any house; and these herms could be taken very seriously. They were square pillars equipped with male genitals; on top of each was the head of Hermes. They marked areas as sacred or designated the bounds of one's home.

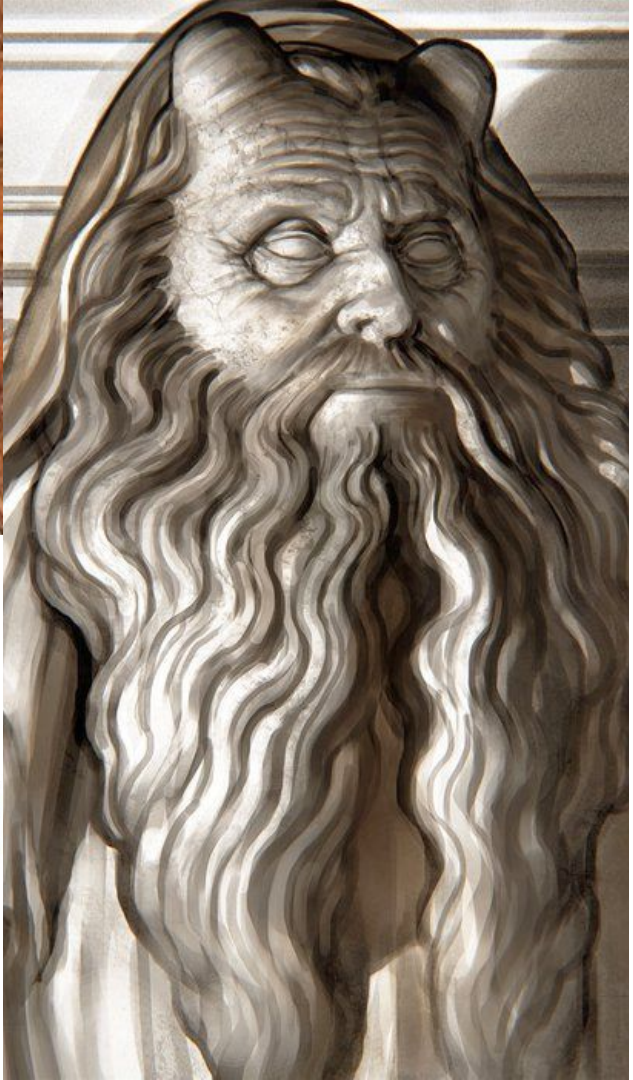
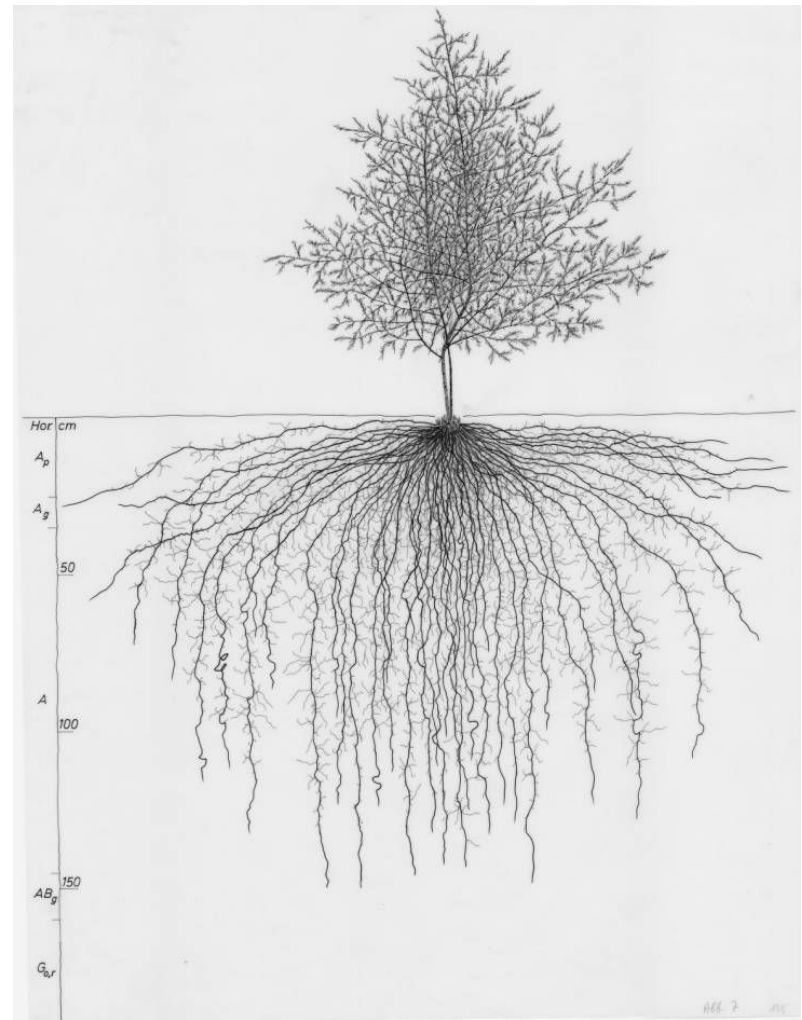




Figure 5: Jung's Model of the Psyche.

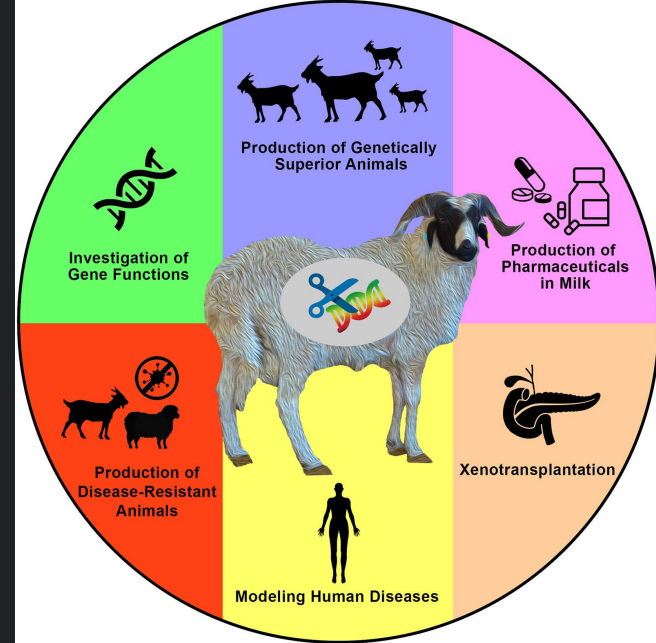


Can you breed son to mother in goats?
